To produce appropriately levelled assessment materials and schemes of work.	<p>99.1% of Key Stage 2 children have represented the school in sporting competitions.</p> <p>75% of pupils in Year 2 have represented the school at a sporting event.</p> <p>We received the Sainsbury's Gold Award for the third year running.</p> <p>Sports are inclusive – with children of all abilities taking part in tournaments and festivals. An increased number of B and C teams taking part.</p> <p>Children taking part in an increased number of inter-school competitions and tournaments. These include: Quad Kids, Tag Rugby, Cross Country, Football, Hockey, Sportshall Athletics, SEN School Games for All, Dodgeball, Cricket and Netball.</p> <p>Due to specialist PE sessions, upskilling of staff, and after school clubs run by the PE coordinator, specialist PE teacher and a teaching assistant, the school have come very high in many sporting areas. These include: Year 5/6 Quad Kids – 1st place, Year 3/4 Quad Kids – 3rd place, coming first in a level 2 Hockey Tournament, then</p>

coming 2nd in the Level 3 tournament – making us 2nd best school in Cheshire.

We came 1st in our heat in the Year 3/4 and 5/6 Sportshall Athletics and then 2nd overall in the Crewe and Nantwich final. We have had 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners in Cross Country competitions. Our Year 3 team came 2nd in a tennis tournament and we came 3rd overall in the annual Town Sports Competition.

We began a Sports Booster Club run weekly by our PE specialist. This club targets those children who may lack some of the fundamental skills required for their overall physical literacy and children who may lack confidence in sport and fitness. This club has given those children increased confidence and they are now entering competitions and tournaments.

All children (regardless of ability) took part in our annual charity race. Each class ran various distances around the 40m track and raised over £4700 for the Donna Louise Hospice Trust.

Sports Week ran for the second year running, with our PE Specialist, teaching staff and outside agencies running lots of different sporting events. These included: golf, dance, Zumba, athletics, football, cricket and goal ball.
